TOGETHER WITH ZOEY

Zoey, 14, meets life's toughest challenges with courage and heart. A devoted big sister to two-year-old Khloe, she's also a talented Escaramuza equestrian—part of a traditional Mexican women's rodeo team performing intricate horseback routines. Yet behind her confidence and humor is a story shaped by challenges no child should face.

In 2022, while her mom, Karina, was six months pregnant and navigating a divorce, Zoey was diagnosed with B-cell Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia. Their Palm Springs home was hours from Rady Children's Hospital. The family didn't know how they would manage—until the Ronald McDonald House opened its doors. "It gave us a little bit of peace, a little bit of normal when everything else felt like it was falling apart," Karina recalls.



After a year of treatment, Zoey rang the hospital bell in celebration, but two weeks later, she relapsed. Once again, the House provided a safe space where the whole family could stay together,

> giving them strength, comfort, and hope for the journey ahead.

MORE FAMILIES

Made possible by early investors in the Imagine the Moment Campaign, these new suites have cut the waitlist for care in half and now give immediate relief to 28 more families who once waited anxiously for a room. They replace our former offices and play yard, which has been reimagined as Cooper's Corner (page 10). Our work continues as we explore ways to expand beyond our main site, so no family has to wait when every moment counts.

This milestone also marked the public launch of the Imagine the Moment Campaign (page 6), brought to life by the vision and generosity of our Trustees, Campaign Collective, lead donors, and construction partners.



That's the magic of Cooper's Corner, a playful space dreamed up by TCWGlobal and its founder and CEO, Samer Khouli. PROGRAM UPDATES

A Time of Growth and Impact

In 2024 and 2025, San Diego's Ronald McDonald House maintained its high level of service while achieving the expansion goals of our **Imagine the Moment Campaign**. During 12 months of major South Wing construction, the House stayed safe and fully operational. As of July 2025, 82 families are benefiting from a room of their own and shared spaces like **Cooper's Corner** and the **Padres Clubhouse**.

With the help of volunteers and community groups, our kitchen served 258,000 meals—the most in our history. Community groups delighted families through activities and performances throughout the year. Enhancements like the new Miyahira Family Courtyard, refreshed furnishings, and updated landscaping made the House even more welcoming.

We've also been preparing for the launch of **Family Support Services** (page 6). Guided by consultations with hospital and community partners and insights from UC-San Francisco researchers, this program will provide holistic emotional and practical support to caregivers, siblings, and staff—helping families stay close and resilient.

Individual and community philanthropy makes this sustained and expanding care possible, bringing deeper support to more families than ever before.

FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

Thanks to the continued generosity of our supporters, our organization's financial strength has grown steadily over the past decade. In 2024, we reported \$16.3 million in revenue and \$10.1 million in expenses, resulting in net income of \$6.2 million. Of that, \$5.3 million was designated for Imagine the Moment Campaign priorities, including the expansion of our House, enhanced family support services, and a stronger endowment.

This continued growth brought us to \$32.0 million in unrestricted net assets and \$50.1 million in total net assets, ensuring we are well-positioned to serve more families in the years ahead. Strengthening our endowment remains a critical priority, and we've grown our donor and board-designated endowment funds to \$10.4 million—helping to secure our mission for the long term. 


Revenue by Type
